History of the Athletic Round Table

Twenty-seven years ago, Jerry Harwin and Caesar Uyesaka sipped coffee at Caesar's Restaurant, talking about the need for a sports group in Santa Barbara that could pitch in and help out the local athletic community in times of need. After Jerry and Caesar shared a couple more coffee breaks together, the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table was born. Its motto: *The advancement and betterment of all sports and athletics in the greater Santa Barbara area.*

The Round Table got off to a fast start. Its first organizational meeting was held at Santa Barbara's East Beach on January 25, 1968. Hundreds of people attended this meeting, and over 200 joined that evening as Charter Members.

The Round Table's first annual banquet was held at Santa Barbara City College on June 22, 1968. A number of outstanding athletes in a variety of sports were honored and the evening's highlight was the induction of local athletes into the Round Table's *Hall of Fame*.

Harry's Plaza Cafe was the site of the Round Table's first press luncheon held on September 14, 1970. This program was initiated by the new-president, Bill Bertka. These weekly luncheons were similar to a "Monday Morning Quarterback Club." All nine area schools were represented by the head coaches of the sport in season. For 25 years, the Round Table luncheons have continued to be held at Harry's every Monday, attended by standing-room only crowds.

Since their first meeting back in 1968, the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table has helped hundreds of individuals and organizations by raising funds to support their athletic programs. Through membership dues, contributions, fund-raisers, and grant applications, the Round Table has raised more than \$1,500,000!

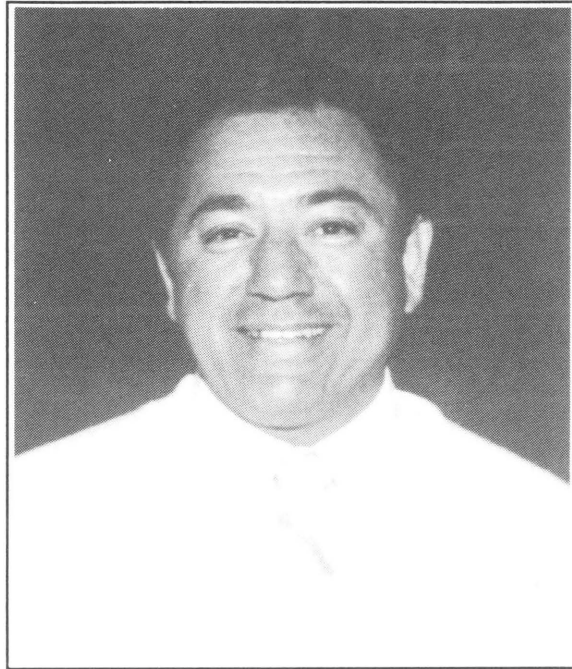
Funds are distributed according to need. The Round Table is proud that it has been able to help athletes at all levels compete in events they would otherwise not have been able to attend. With continued community support, the Round Table is confident Santa Barbara's sports opportunities will continue to grow with each new season.

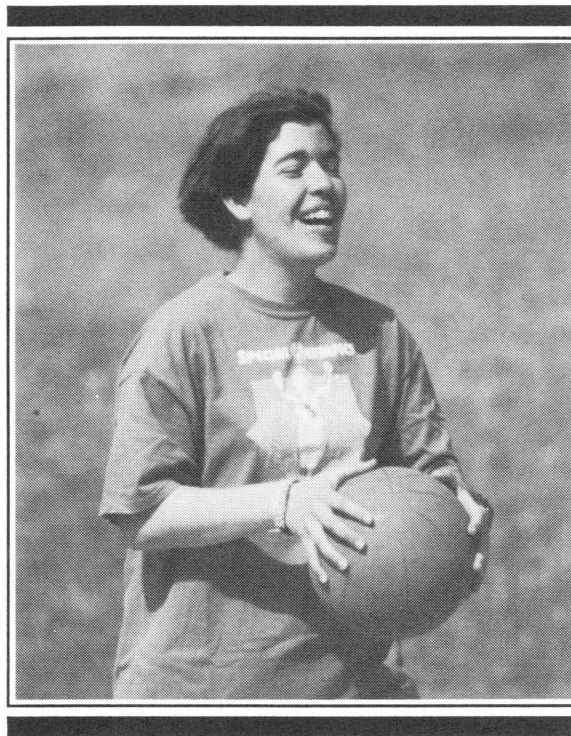

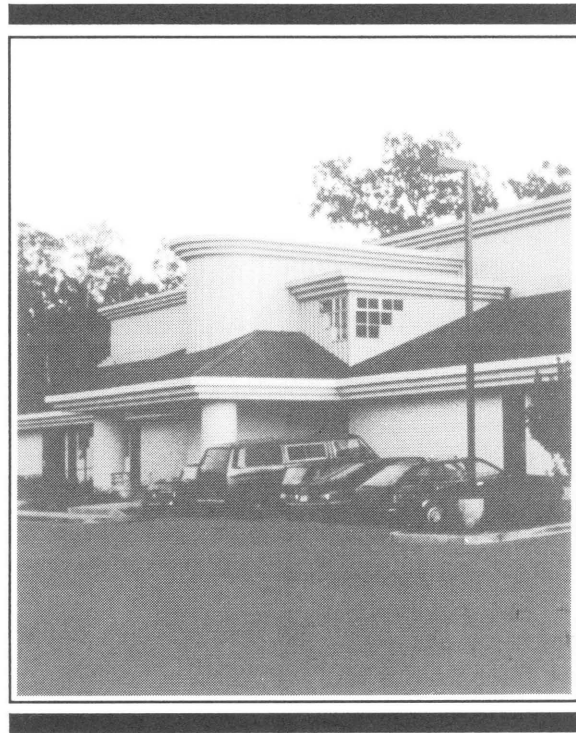

Goleta Valley Youth Sports Association

The Goleta Valley Youth Sports Association is a six acre sports complex located at 4550 Hollister. It includes a 23,740 square foot multi-purpose sports and recreation center, 16,000 square feet of playing surface, has 400 spectator seats, two regulation basketball courts and several volleyball courts.

The committee, which selects the recipient of the R.F. MacFarland Memorial Trophy saw an organization that has made a tremendous contribution to not only the youth of their community, but to the adult population as well. They saw a vision that had come to fruition, a goal accomplished. They saw a group of parents, businessmen, and civic leaders, led by Vaughn Wipf and Ed Holdren, that recognized the need for a centralized organization to coordinate existing non-profit youth sports and recreational programs in the Goleta Valley. In order to accomplish this goal, the founders initiated a drive that resulted in the physical plant they knew was an absolute necessity. Today there are 1700 youths from 5 to 28 years of age playing volleyball, basketball, hockey, baseball, and attending the Christmas Sports Camp, and hundreds of adults participating in an *open gym* program. 1000's of families have been enjoying this facility since 1991 because of a group of civic minded citizens who cared about their community.

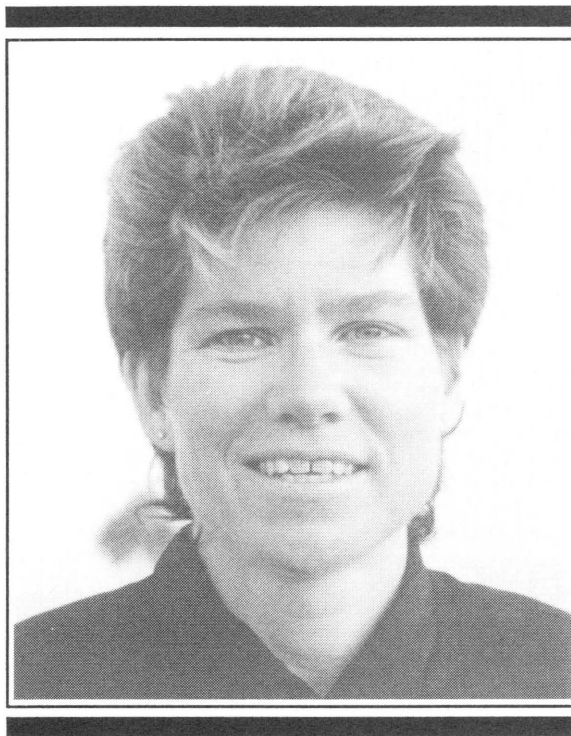
The new name for this facility is *Youth Sports Association*. Their stated purpose is: "*Use of this facility is open to all members of our community regardless of race, creed, nationality, age, gender, physical capability or developmental ability.*" With great pride, the committee presents the Youth Sports Association with the R.F. MacFarland Award.

Louise Lowry Davis Award

Louise Lowry Davis was Supervisor of the S.B. Recreation Dept. for over 30 years before retirement in 1966. As director of the Women's Sports League, she made women's sports activities one of the biggest draws in town in the 1930's and 1940's. This award is given to a woman recognized as a player, coach or sponsor who excels in leadership and sportsmanship.

The Athletic Round Table is proud to recognize one of the true local supporters for women in sports. Ellen O'Connor developed and has helped organize the Annual Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table event for Women and Girls in Sports for the past three years. This day is held to recognize the achievement and leadership of women in sports.

Ellen is also the Head Women's Basketball Coach and Director of the Fitness and Wellness Program at SBCC. She came to Santa Barbara after leading UC Davis Women's Basketball Team from 1980-1987, first as an Assistant Coach and later as the Head Coach. While at Davis, she was part of a task force to increase attendance at basketball games. Attendance tripled in a 3-year period.

Ellen started her sports career as an athlete at UC Berkeley where she received her B.A. and many academic-athletic awards. She received her M.A. at UC Davis while she was coaching and doing clinical research on prevention of hypertension.

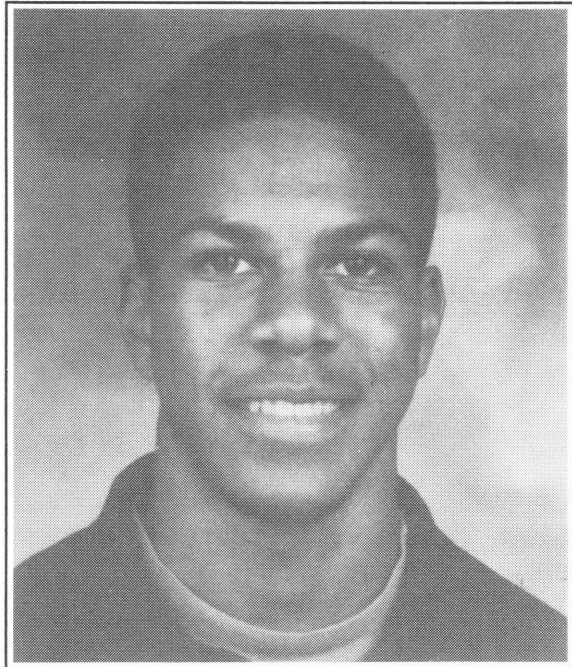
Ellen epitomizes the leadership qualities of the award's founder as she is involved in sports, fitness, wellness and academics.

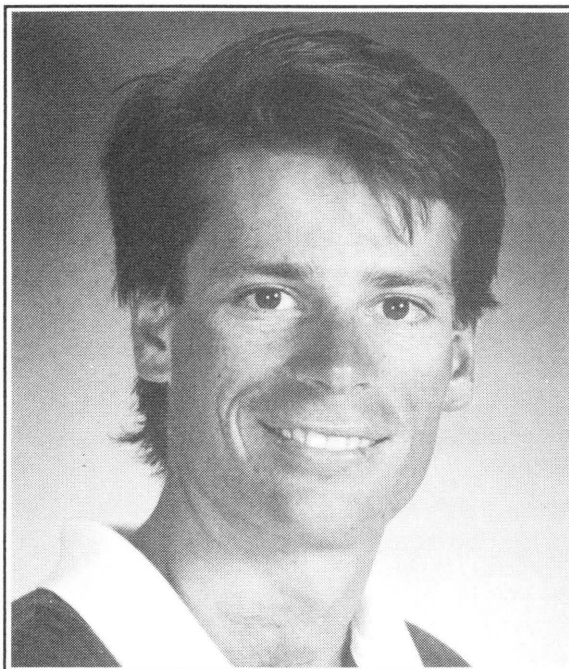

Chris Russell
UCSB Women's Tennis

Chris Russell is finishing his 4th season at the UCSB Women's Tennis Coach. Russell led the Gauchos to their 4th consecutive Big West Conference Championship this spring and earned Big West Coach of the Year honors for himself for the 4th straight year. The Gauchos have earned the league title since 1991 and have had 3 conference Players of the Year during that span. UCSB is 89-8 against Big West teams. The Gauchos have not lost a Big West dual match since the 1988-89 season. Russell has a 54-31 dual match record at UCSB.

Russell has a history of coaching success. He served as interim Head Coach of the Men's Tennis Team at UCSB for the 1988-89 season. During this season, Russell led the Gauchos to a 20-8 record with wins over three nationally ranked squads and was named Big West Coach of the Year. UCSB's # 1 player, Kip Brady, reached All-American status under Russell's tutelage.

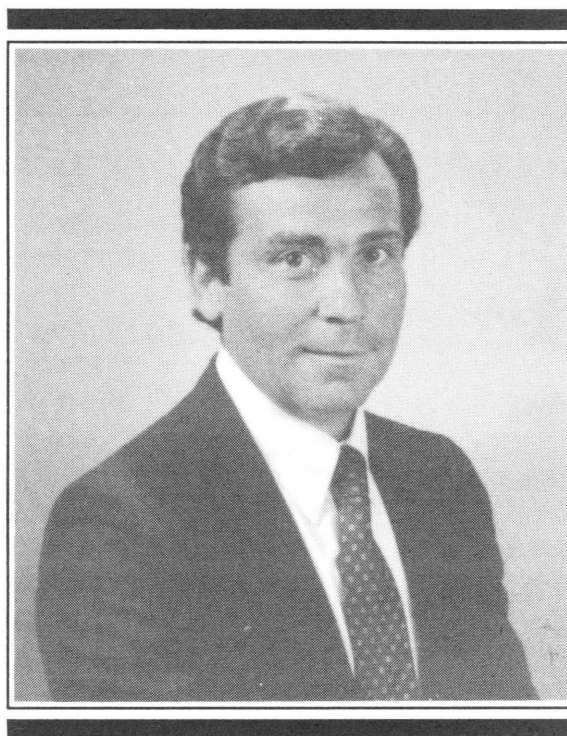
Russell coached on the men's A.T.P. Tour and traveled internationally during 1989-90 before returning to Santa Barbara. A native of Monterey, California, Russell has also been head tennis professional for the City of Santa Barbara.

Russell, a fine doubles player at UCSB, still holds the Gaucho's best doubles record to date with a 17-6 record in 1984 with partner John Washer and were Big West Conference Championship runner-ups. Russell received his bachelor's degree from UCSB in 1986.

Joel Garbarino represents a special new breed dedicated to youth sports...*the walk-on-coach!* He is the first recipient of this award who is not also a professional educator. He humbly accepts this accolade on behalf of all *walk-on-coaches* who donate their time to serve youth. Joel receives the same reward that motivates all coaches: "seeing the kids get better and grow into successful young adults."

Joel grew up playing baseball in the Sacramento area. After graduating with a Master's Degree in Aeroscience from UC Berkeley in 1966, he found himself in Santa Barbara pursuing a career and raising 3 daughters. He played fast and slow pitch softball until graduating to coaching his daughters. Ehron, Galen and Lorin have all been key components on their father's teams. He helped establish the local Goleta Wave's traveling softball team for girls under age 14 years and has been coaching youth softball for the past 13 years. Michelle, his wife of 29 years, has served as assistant coach, and score-keeper for Joel. His other career is serving as Chairman and Senior Scientist at Toyon Research in Goleta.

Joel's teams have progressed from a record of 11-13 his first year, to a top 16 finish in CIF last year, to this year's 17-3 record. He credits his success to a combination of hard work and great kids. His coaching philosophy relies on preparing to win, then allowing the kids to enjoy the contest. His team is also rated #1 academically, with a team GPA of 3.67 (out of 450 schools!)...an honor earned for the second year in a row!

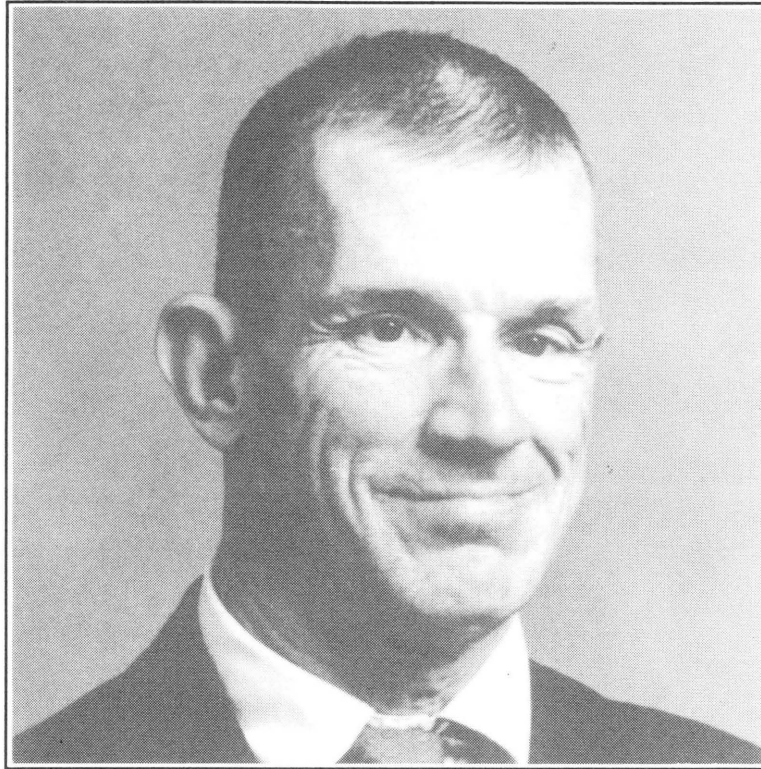

Phil Womble *Special Achievement*

Don Volpi Coach

There are not enough Don Volpis in our world of athletics. This man whose presence we so genuinely enjoyed was not with us long enough. Don Volpi, Dos Pueblos High School Basketball Coach and teacher of 25 years died at the age of 49.

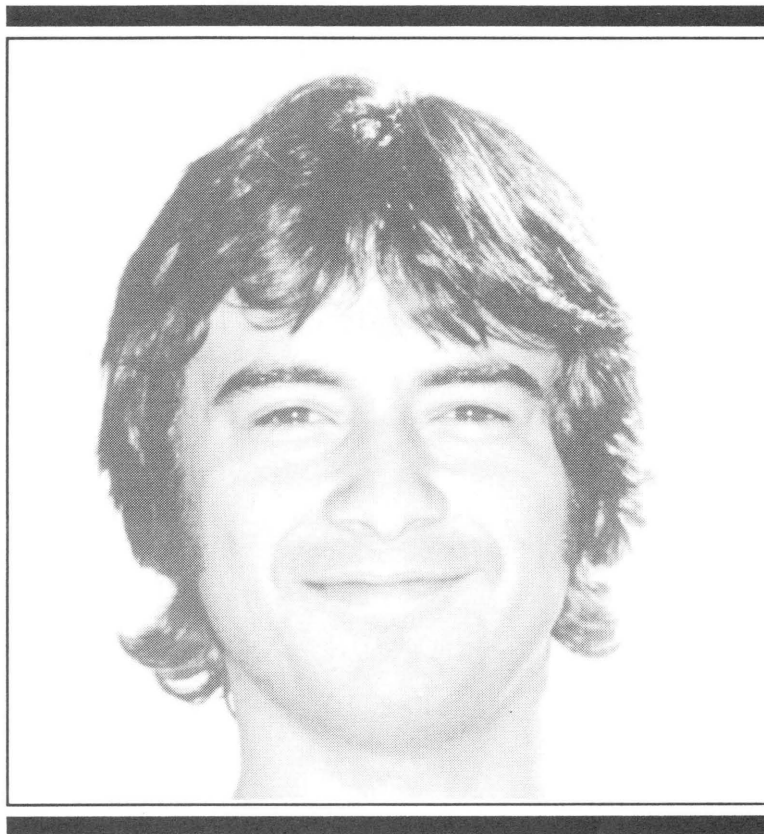
Tonight we are honoring his tremendous contributions to the athletic community and to all of the young Chargers fortunate enough to have been blessed with his tutelage.

After an Air Force stint where he was named All-Europe, and a short stay at BYU, he enrolled at UCSB where he became team captain and Most Valuable Player in the Gaucho basketball program. Don began a teaching career that would include becoming the head basketball coach at Dos Pueblos after attaining his BA and MA in Physical Education.

In the 1970–71 season, Volpi reached the pinnacle of his career, a CIF AAA Division championship. While the CIF championship remains one of the great achievements in the spirited history of the Chargers, his own career was a continuing series of pinnacles. Extremely popular, the quiet but intense Volpi was highly respected by players, opposing coaches and officials. His even temperament, consideration and sensitivity were always evident. He was one of the *good guys* and someone you were always happy to see.

While he continued to play and scout basketball, what he really cherished was fishing at Lake Cachuma with his father-in-law, Van Christy. His wife, Gerry, and daughters, Janahn Foster and Robin McCourt, join us in welcoming Don Volpi into the "Hall."

Raul (Rudy) Ybarra *Outstanding Athlete*

When Joaquin and Socorro Ybarra christened Raul Ybarra, it was a near certainty that he would be involved in soccer in the community. But it might not have been so certain that little Rudy would grow into a soccer giant and the Hall of Fame athlete that he will become tonight.

Under the tutelage of Coach Manuel Lito Garcia, he led the fledgling soccer program at Santa Barbara High School to the very top. Ybarra became the finest soccer player in Southern California, and probably the state. Plain old All-CIF was not enough, this young man was named CIF Player of the Year in both 1975 and 1976.

Ybarra played high school soccer with class, style and intelligence far beyond his years, so well that he entered professional soccer soon after his SBCC studies ended. He was named the 1978 Rookie of the Year in the North American Soccer League.

In 1979 he was a member of the USA Olympic team, led his team to the Western Soccer League Championship in 1986, and to the California State Championship in 1991 and 1992.

His coaching future looks just a bright. He was an assistant coach of the state champion Santa Barbara Soccer Club, head coach of the Central Coast all-stars, also a state champion, and is currently the head Boys' Soccer Coach at Santa Barbara High School. Ybarra is presently the Athletic Equipment Manager at his alma mater and also serves as their trainer.

Articulate and intelligent, the words greatness and Hall of Fame seem to fit very well. With Rudy are his wife Lourdes (Guzman) and sons, Marco, 13, Raul Jr. 9, and Juan Pablo, 6. The Ybarra soccer tradition appears to be in good hands. Be proud, Joaquin and Socorro!

Debbie (Willie) Haliday *Outstanding Athlete*

Debbie Willie: All-CIF. All-PAC 10. All-American. National Champion. Wife. Mother. University basketball coach. Christian leader.

What else is there? Four year All-American in softball, and reportedly the only freshman in NCAA history to play on two national championship teams in her freshman year (basketball and softball at UCLA).

But it all started at San Marcos High School where Debbie's classic jump shot and superior basketball skills established her as the first of our great female athletes in the modern movement of girls' sports.

Followed by an all-CIF performance in softball on the Royal diamond, UCLA knew a great athlete when they saw one. They were right, and Debbie was on her way to an unbelievable run of athletic

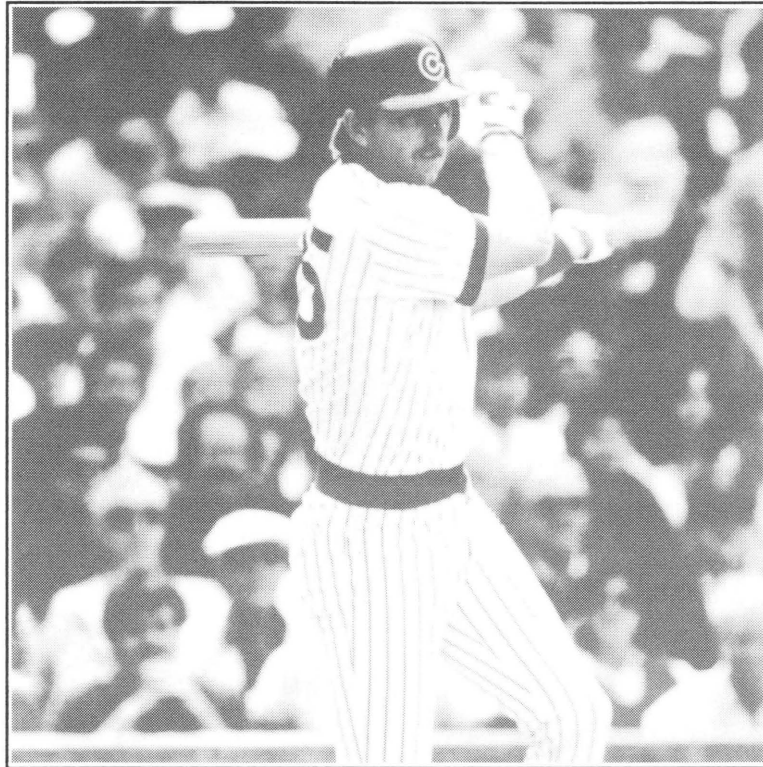
success at that university. As a point guard and co-captain in UCLA's outstanding women's basketball team, Debbie was selected to the prestigious All-PAC-10 team.

Gary Woods is forever a Major Leaguer and this is how it happened:

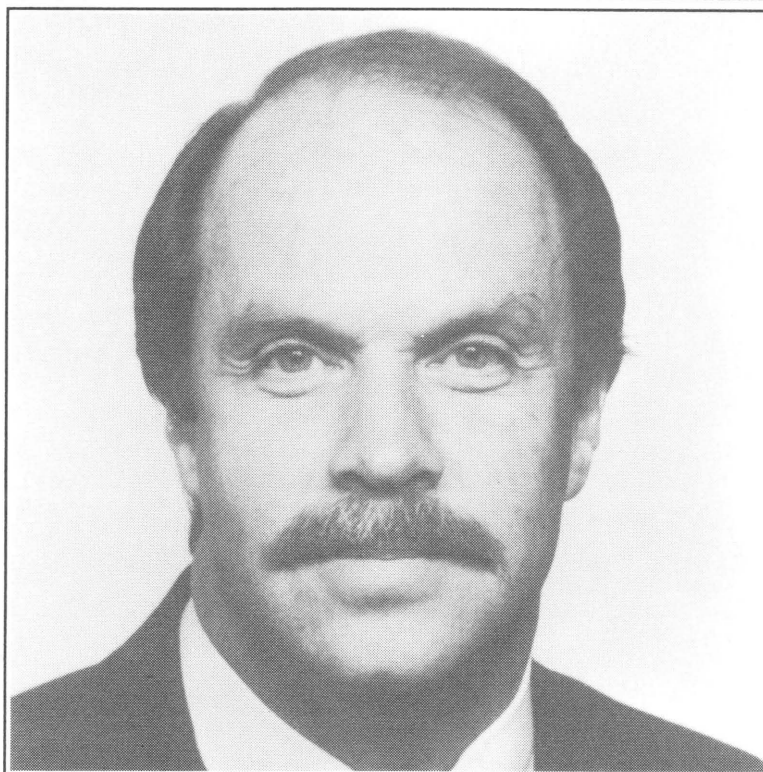
- Played professional baseball for 14 years

Community Leader

Bill Levy graduated from San Marcos High School in 1965, but he left his heart in the world of education.

His real estate and business ventures are legendary in Santa Barbara. In 1988, he was selected as Santa Barbara Businessman of the Year and he is a member of the Mayor's Business Council.

He is in the Corporate Circle of Hope of the American Cancer Society, a member of the Fighting Back Task Force for the Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse, and an Honorary Member of the Advisory Board of the Arthritis Foundation.
